1. Observe the title of the book on the front cover. Discuss how the typeface reflects the book's subject.

2. Research the meaning of the word *font*. See how many different 'fire' fonts you can find on the internet.

What features do they have in common?

3. In the space below, design your own fire font. Use the pale letters as a guide to spacing. Give your font a name:

7. Both *Flood* and *Fire* end with a message of hope and regeneration. Research the role of fire in the regeneration of Australia's natural environment including how it was used by Indigenous Australians. Present your findings in a one-page report.
